Our state-of-the-art facilities and comprehensive curriculum ensure that students are not only academically accomplished but also equipped with the leadership qualities and social consciousness needed to drive positive change.

The Rochas Foundation College, Owerri is the pioneer school of the Foundation. It was established in 2001 at the old IBC, Orji along Owerri-Okigwe Road Imo state.

The College currently has a staff strength of 45 dedicated teachers and 807 students. In 2012, RFC Owerri was awarded with the WAEC's Best School Award.




Rochas Foundation College, Jos was established in 2005 in Plateau State, the home of peace and tourism, along the old airport road, Jos, Plateau State. The school has a staff strength of 41 teachers and 872 students. It is one of the leading secondary schools in the city of Jos with several awards attached to its name.



Rochas Foundation College, Bauchi is located along Gombe road, opposite the State House of Assembly, Bauchi State. It was founded in the year 2018. The School currently has over 39 teachers and 594 students.

The students are groomed both educationally and in other areas of endeavors, such as sports, art and debate amongst other activities in order to enhance creativity and harness their team spirit and it has become one of the leading schools in the city of Bauchi.



Rochas Foundation College, Yola was established in 2018. It is located at the government approved layout Misc 7, old Golf Course, along Yola-Mubi road, Yola, Adamawa State. The School currently has staff strength of 41 dedicated teachers and it is furnished with all basic amenities. Due to the excellent performance in both internal and external examinations and competitions, the school has seen a rise in the number of new intakes yearly with a growing population of 584 students, currently.



Rochas Foundation College, Kano was established in 2004 in the northern part of Nigeria and in the second most industrious city at No 92, Airport road, Nomanland, Kano State.

The School currently has staff strength of 41 teachers and 78 students with over two thousand (2,000) graduates.



Rochas Foundation College, Sokoto is located in the extreme northwest of Nigeria at Km 13, Gusau road, after River Basin, Dange Shuni, Sokoto State.

It was established in 2018 with a growing population of 400 and 39 teachers. The school has a serene environment with well-equipped libraries and a world class sports team.

Known for its outstanding performance in national competitions across the state, it is arguably amongst the best ten (10) junior schools in the state of Sokoto.



Rochas Foundation College, Ibadan, was established in 2005. It is located in the largest city in West Africa and former administrative city of the old Western region, located along N.T.C road Oke-Ado, Ibadan. RFC Ibadan is equipped with sound and committed teachers, and essential amenities necessary for intellectual development.

Since the establishment, it has increased in staff strength and student population. It currently has a staff strength of 46 teachers and 826 students



Rochas Foundation College Enugu is located in the coal city of Enugu. It is arguably one of the best junior secondary schools in Nigeria. It was established in 2018 and it is located at the airport road opposite Akanu Ibiam International Airport Enugu.

It provides top notch quality free education in the city of Enugu. It currently has staff strength of 35 teachers and 561.





It is the latest college of the foundation, established to cater for the needs of less privileged children in the South-south geopolitical zone of Nigeria. It has a staff strength of 24 teachers and 330 students



The basic school in Obiohia was established in 2009. The school has since inception set the pace for basic education in Imo State, Nigeria with multiple awards and recognition.


The school is located at No. 1 Ogboko Road, Obiohia Junction, Ideato – South, Imo State.
